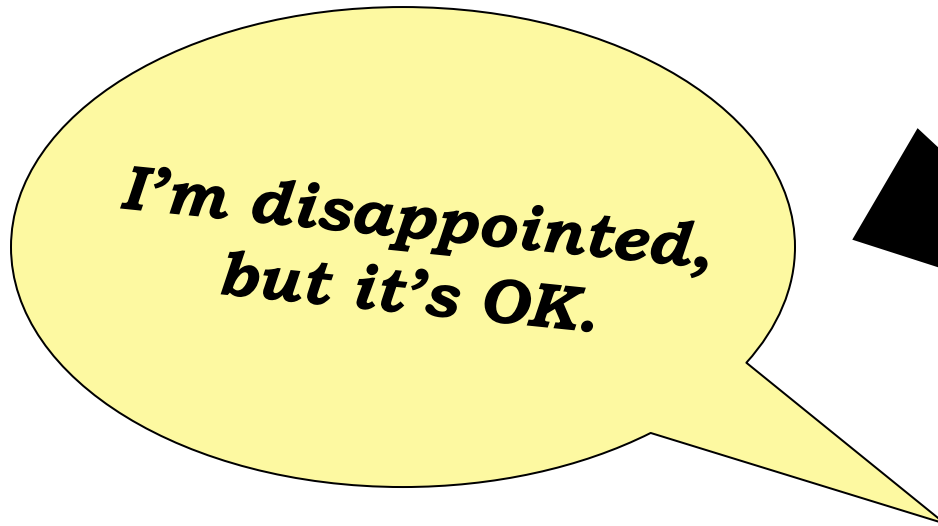
**I can't be line leader every time we line up.

I know I'll get another turn to be line leader soon.

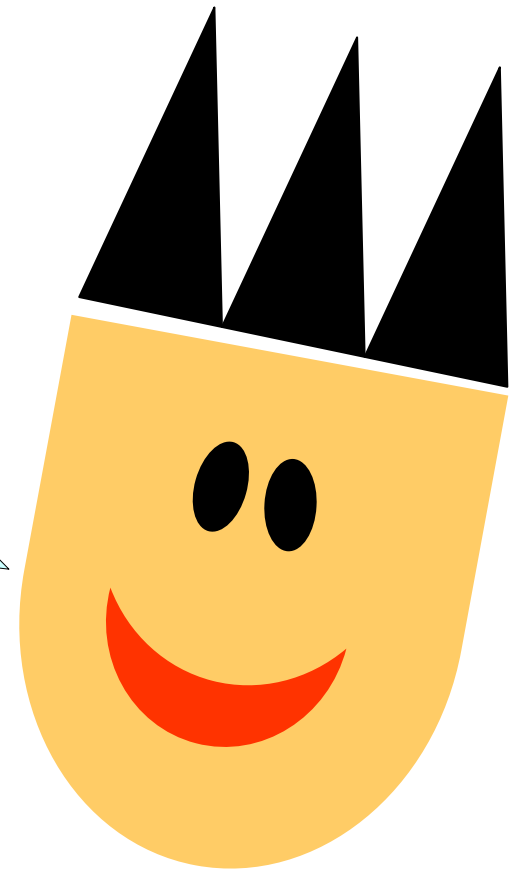


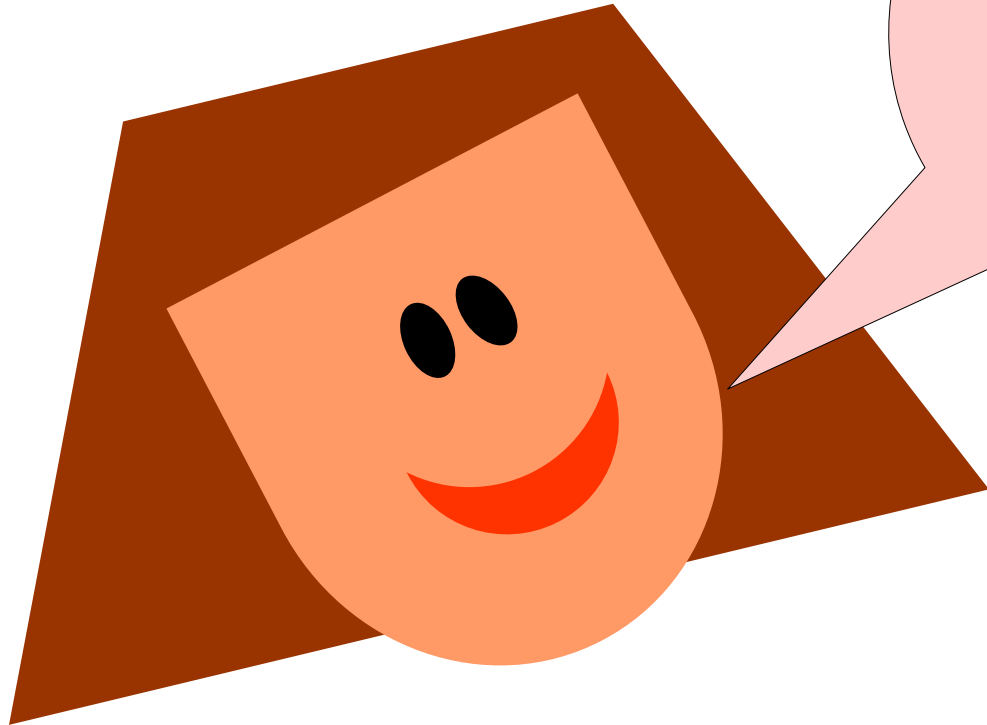

There can only be one line leader, and now it's my friend's turn.

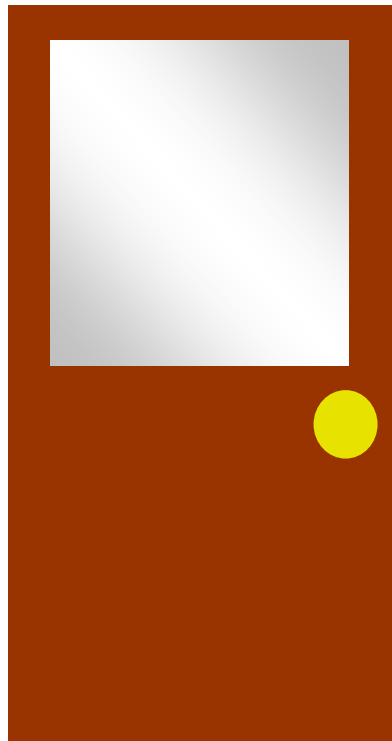
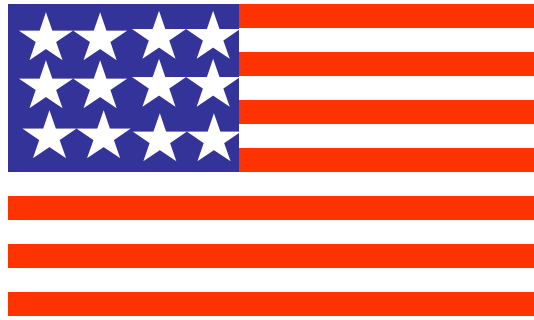
